

## **The University of North Carolina at Greensboro 2000-2001 Profile**

**History/Location:** The University of North Carolina at Greensboro's Carnegie Classification is as a Doctoral University I. The University was established in 1891 and became coeducational in 1963. The 190-acre campus is located 1 mile from the center of Greensboro, a city of 208,210. The Greensboro/Winston-Salem/High Point Metropolitan Statistical Area has a population of approximately 1,190,618.

**Academic Schools/Programs and Degrees:** Arts and Sciences; Business and Economics; Education; Health and Human Performance; Human Environmental Sciences; Music; Nursing; and Graduate School. UNCG offers over 100 undergraduate, 59 masters, and 14 doctoral programs. In 1999-00 UNCG awarded 1,854 bachelor's, 705 master's and 88 doctoral degrees. Doctoral degrees were awarded in English, Psychology, Education, Human Environmental Sciences, Exercise and Sports Science, and Music.

**Faculty:** In 2000-01, there were 762 budgeted FTE faculty positions and the student/faculty ratio was 14.8:1. 49.9% of full-time faculty are tenured, while 88.6% hold the doctorate or terminal professional degree in their field. Average 2000-01 AAUP Salaries are \$78,762 for Full Professors, \$56,947 for Associate Professors, and \$46,665 for Assistant Professors.

**Enrollment:** Fall 2000 headcount enrollment, (excluding extension) was 12,731 (11,243 FTE), including 10,021 (9,273 FTE) undergraduates and 2,710 (2,006 FTE) graduate students. 8,415 (84%) of undergraduate and 994 (37%) of graduate students were enrolled on a full-time basis. 33% of undergraduate students were male. 10% of undergraduate and 16% of graduate students are from out-of-state. 19% of undergraduate and 11% of graduate students are African-American. 33% of undergraduate students live in residence halls.

**Admissions/Retention:** 1,891 Freshmen and 882 Transfers enrolled for the first-time in Fall 2000. 74% of freshman applicants were accepted and 38% enrolled. The average SAT score for enrolled freshmen was 1037. The middle 50% ranges for SAT scores were 460-570 for Verbal and 450-560 for Math. 74% percent of Fall 1999 Freshmen returned in Fall 2000, and 47% of freshmen graduated within six years.

**Costs:** Annual 2000-01 full-time tuition/fees are \$2,249 (in-state) and \$10,703 (out-of-state). Room and Board is \$4,186.

**Budget:** For 1999-00, IPEDS Total Current Funds Revenues were \$193,107,751, including \$84,598,460 (43.8%) in State Appropriations. Total Current Funds Expenditures and Transfers were \$203,577,098. Total Educational and General Expenditures and Transfers were \$166,613,093. IPEDS Research Expenditures were \$11,914,107.

**Institutional Affiliations:** UNCG is a member of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges (NASULGC) and the American Association of Colleges and Universities (AACSC). In athletics, UNCG began NCAA Division IA competition in 1991, and is a member of the Southern Conference.
