

Enrollment Trends at University of North Carolina at Greensboro, Fall 2013 thru Fall 2018

1) UNCG Compares With Itself and Its In-State Peers Fall 2013 thru Fall 2018

Total Enrollment Growth Compared With NC Peers:

The student enrollment at UNCG has been growing from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018 by 2.2% annually, 0.9% from last year and 11.2% over the period. Such a growth rate is ahead of that of ECU (1.0% annually), but behind that of UNCC (2.3% annually) and NCAT (2.8% annually). [See Page 6 for details.](#)

Enrollment by IPEDS Ethnicity:

The Hispanic student population has seen the largest margin of growth during the period from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018. Asian students also had a large margin of increase. Black students increased almost by a third over the 6-year period. White students decreased by -7% over the period, by -2% annually and by -3% last year. [Please see Page 8 for more details.](#)

Graduate Enrollment:

Comparing the graduate school enrollments at the state peers, UNCG has been doing well during the 6-year period. Among the peers, UNCC was the only one that went up: 5% over the period. The others all went down. However, UNCG fell by the smallest margin: -0.5% over the period, compared to -4.9% for ECU and -10.4% for NCAT. [Please see Page 6 for details.](#)

Types of Degrees Pursued:

Over the 6-year period, from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, UNCG's undergraduate enrollment grew by 15%, 3% annually and 2% from last year. Doctor's enrollment, doctorate and doctoral professional combined, increased by 6% annually, by 32% over the period and by 0% from last year. Master's enrollment shrank by -4% over the same period, by -1% annually, and by -2% from last year. [Please see Page 7 for more details.](#)

White, Non-White and Black growths:

With the number of White students declining, and the number of Non-White students increasing, Fall 2018 is the pivot point where for the first time Non-White students outnumbered White students on campus. With the White students declining by -2% annually and Black students increasing by 6% annually, in Fall 2030 there will be more Black students than White students on campus. Living on Campus:

Typically about 80% of the first-time new undergraduates live on campus. That number has been growing by 2% annually and 8.5% from last year. [See Page 10 for details.](#)

The Undergraduate Entering New Classes:

The first-time new undergraduate class has been growing by a considerable margin from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018: 12% over the period, 2 annually and 7% from last year. Over the same period, the undergraduate new transfer class grew by even a larger margin: 26% over the period, 5% annually and 2% for last year. The continuing students, in terms of the average annual growth over the period, lags behind that of the first-time and that of the new transfers, which leads our attention to the retention phenomenon. **Please see Page 11 for details.**

1-Year Retention by Ethnicity:

UNCG made an impressive improvement in retaining Black students by 3.7 percentage points over the period studied. Despite of the improvement, UNCG is still behind the state average in Black retention: 80.3% compared to 82.1%. UNCG's Hispanic retention averages 76.5% compared to the state peers' 78.7%. UNCG's White retention averages 74.2% compared to ECU 80.7% and UNCC 80.0%. **Please see Page 13 for details.**

Retention and Enrollment Growth:

If the University pursues an enrollment expansion as a strategic goal, improving its student retention looks like one of the avenues to help achieve it, as enrollment is a function of recruitment and retention. In improving retention, that of the White students may be the primary task, as it is currently way behind ECU and UNCC. Imagine if the 1-year retention improves by 3%, what impact would that have on the total enrollment!

1-year Retention:

As the University's total enrollment lagged behind the growth of the incoming classes, it is almost certain that we lost more students to retention: UNCG's entering cohorts' 1-year retention averaged 77% compared to the state peers average 80%, tied with NCAT, but four percentage points behind UNCC or ECU.

UNCG's retention improvement also lagged behind its state peers, as for the period studied UNCG improved 0.4 percentage points annually, compared to the state peers' average 1.1 percentage points. Over the period, UNCG improved by 2 percentage points compared to the state peers' 5 percentage points. **Please see Page 12 for more details.**

6-Year Graduation:

UNCG's 6-year graduation rate has been higher than the average of the state peers and the national peers. However, much of that advantage was lost in recent years when its 6-year graduation rate dropped to 54%, the same as UNCC, 8% behind ECU, and only better than NCAT. **For more details please see Page 14.**

First-generation, Low Family Income and Pell Grants:

About one third undergraduates are first generation college students. That percentage has been going down slightly. The percentage of students from low-income families has been going up slightly. The percentage of students receiving Pell has been going up slightly. **See Page 15 for more details!**

Enrollment by NC Counties:

UNCG's enrollment is highly concentrated in the areas surrounding Greensboro. Guilford alone provides close to one third of the in-state enrollment. However, the enrollment from Guilford has been declining in the period examined: -8% over the period, -2% annually and -2% from last year. **Please see Page 17 for details.**

Enrollment by College and Schools:

Professional enrollment outgrew liberal arts enrollment over the past six years, as Business and Economics chalked off the largest increase: 5% annually, 30% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018 and 4% last year. Nursing, Visual and Performing Arts, and Health and Human Sciences all had a 12% growth over the 6-year period. While School of Education had a -8% decrease over the same time period. **Please see Page 18 for details.**

Enrollment by In- and Out-State Residency:

UNCG is becoming more in-state than out-state, as over the 6-year period from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, the in-state enrollment at UNCG grew by 14%, by 3% annually and by 2% last year. At the same time, the out-state population dipped by -13% over the period, by -3% annually and by -12% last year. As a result, at the beginning of the period, nine percent of the total student body were from out of state, but in Fall 2018 there are seven percent out of state. **Please see Page 16 for more details.**

International Enrollment:

International enrollment or non-resident aliens, increased by 14% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, and by 3% annually during the period, but dropped by -4% from last year. **Please see Page 8 for details.**

On-line Enrollment vs. Face to Face:

The number of the students who took all their classes online increased by 85% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, by 14% annually and by 20% from last year. The number of the students who did not take any classes on line decreased by -8% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, by -2% annually and by -5% last year. The total online credit hours increased by 77% over the period, by 12% annually and by 13% last year. **Please see Page 21 for details.**

Quality of Incoming First-time Full-time Undergraduate Classes:

The quality of the entering class is as important as affecting the educational process and determining the educational outcomes. Core measurements are as follows:

- 1) SAT Verbal increased from 511 in Fall 2013 to 554 in Fall 2017, with Fall 2017 and Fall 2018 being significantly higher.
- 2) SAT Math was significantly higher in Fall 2017 and Fall 2018.
- 3) SAT Total was significantly higher in Fall 2017 and Fall 2018.
- 4) High school GPA was significantly higher in recent years.
- 5) The average age of the first time full-time class was significantly younger.
- 6) The first time full-time class registered for significantly more credit hours in the fall semester.

Fastest Growing Undergraduate Majors:

A list of fastest growing undergraduate majors in the six years includes:

- 1) Peace and Conflict Studies: 7700% over the period, 179% annually.
- 2) Philosophy: 258% over the period, 30% annually and 25% last year.
- 3) Pre-Public Health: 200% over the period, 28% annually and 2% last year.
- 4) Speech Pathology and Audiology: 103% over the period, 17% annually and 32% last year.
- 5) Pre-Kinesiology: 94% over the period, 19% annually, but dipped by -17% last year.
- 6) Info System and Supply Chain Management: 65% over the period, 12% annually, but dipped by -17% last year.
- 7) Interior Architecture: 53% over the period, 10% annually and 19% last year.
- 8) Computer Science: 52% over the period, 9% annually, but dropped by -3% last year.
- 9) Consumer April Retail St: 42% over the period, 7% annually and 12% last year.
- 10) Finance: 29% over the period, 7% annually, but dropped by -30% last year.
- 11) Nursing: 28% over the period, 5% annually, but dropped by -12% last year.
- 12) Drama: 24% over the period, 4% annually, and 7% last year.
- 13) Economics: 24% over the period, 6% annually, but dropped by -11% last year.
- 14) Pre-Social Work: 23% over the period, 5% annually, but dropped by -14% last year.
- 15) Media Studies: 21% over the period, 4% annually, and 7% last year.

UNCG Compares With National Peers and In-State Peers Fall 2012 thru Fall 2017

White Student Population Change at UNCG Compared With State and National Peers:

Over the six years, Fall 2012 - Fall 2017, the White student population at UNCG dipped faster than its state peers and national peers, as the enrollment of White students at UNCG went down by -2.1% annually, while the state peers' average was up by 0.2% and the national average was down by -1.7% annually. The share of White students in the total student population shrank by -2 percentage points annually over the period from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017. This is a quicker shrinking rate than the state peers' average (-1 percentage point) and the national peers' average (-1.2 percentage points). **For more details please see Page 24.**

Non-Resident Alien Students at UNCG Compared With State and National Peers:

Over the six years, Fall 2012 - Fall 2017, enrollment of international students (Non-Resident Alien) at UNCG went up by 4.2% annually. Though impressive, this growth rate was slower than that for the state peers (5.5%), and about the same as the national peers (4.1%). **Please see Page 27 for details.**

In- and Out-State Enrollments at UNCG Compared With State and National Peers:

UNCG is becoming more in-state than out-state in the last six years from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, evidenced by that its in-state first-time new undergraduate enrollment increased by 3.2% while the out-state enrollment decreased by -7.4%, compared with its state peers' averages 2.3% and -2.3% respectively. Over the same time, the national peers increased their out of state enrollment by 5.7% annually. **Please see Page 28 for details.**

Black Student Population Change at UNCG Compared With State and National Peers:

Over the six years, Fall 2012 - Fall 2017, enrollment of Black students at UNCG went up by 4.4% annually, compared to the state peers' 2.1% and the national peers' 0.8%.

The share of Black students in the total student population grew by 0.7 percentage points annually over the period from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017. This is a quicker growth than the state peers' average and the national peers' average. **For more details please see Page 25.**

The Graduate and Undergraduate Portions at UNCG Compared With State and National Peers:

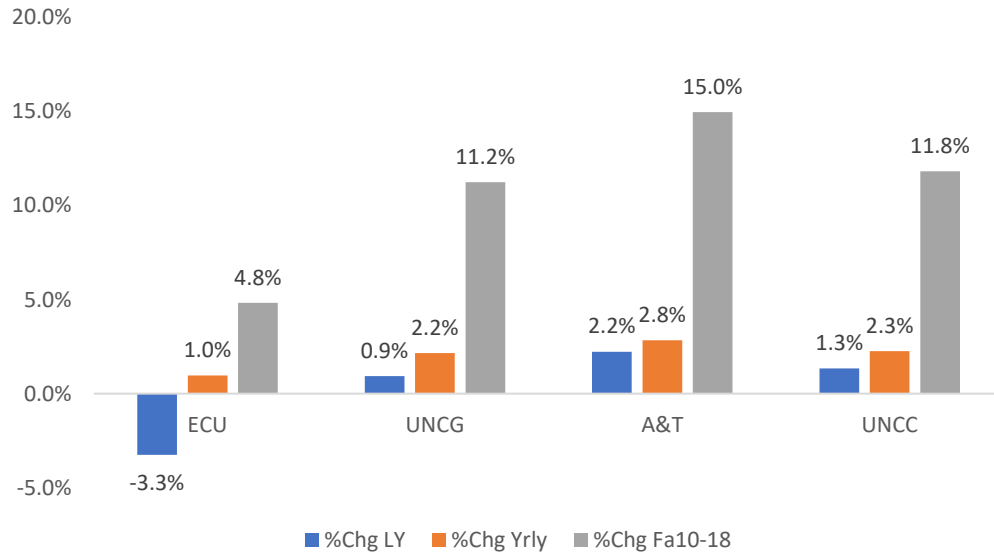
The graduate population at UNCG increased only by 0.1% annually over the Fall 2012 - 17 period, compared to 0.7% annually for the in-state peers and 0.8% annually for the national peers. Apparently UNCG has not been growing its graduate school as fast as its state or national peers.

UNCG's graduate school, as of the total enrollment, became smaller, compared with its state and national peers. **For more**

Enrollment % Change, UNCG vs. In-State Peers

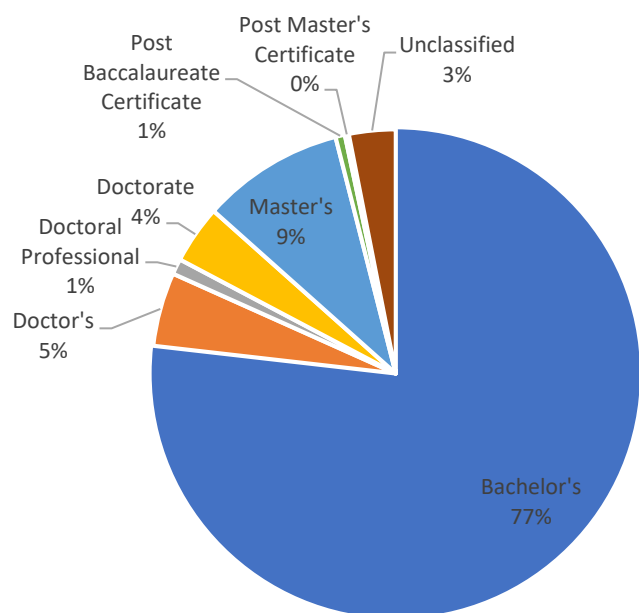

Enrollment % of Total by Degree Type

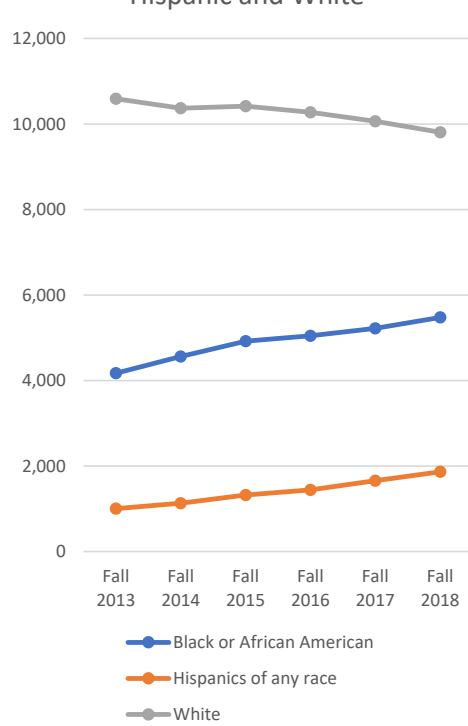
UNCG is an undergraduate-heavy university, as its undergraduate population takes about 80% of its total, master's about 10%, doctorates 5%, and 5% others.

Over the 6-year period, from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, UNCG's undergraduate enrollment grew by 15%, 3% annually and 2% from last year. Doctor's enrollment, doctorate and doctoral professional combined, increased by 6% annually, by 32% over the period and by 0% from last year. Master's enrollment shrank by -4% over the same period, by -1% annually, and by -2% from last year.

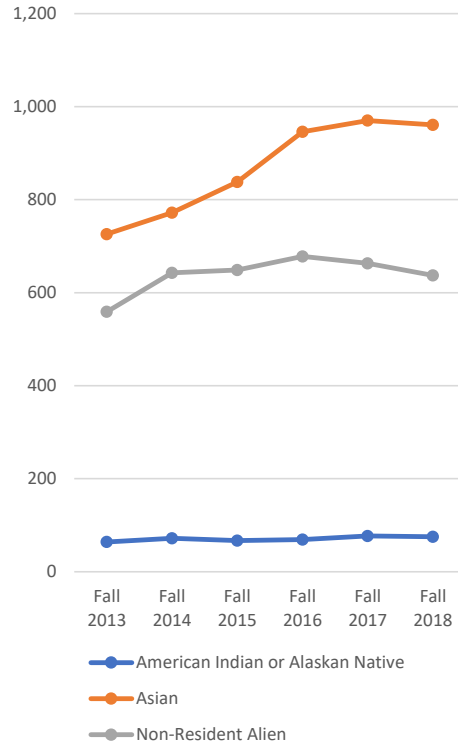

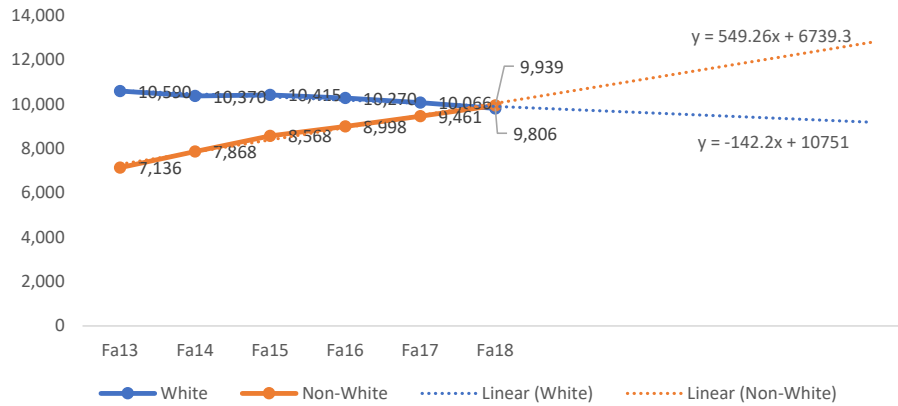
If we examine the enrollment trends by ethnicity, these momentums present themselves:

- Over the 6-year period, Hispanics had the largest margin of growth: 86% over the period, 13% annually and 12% from last year.
- The second largest growth was Two or more races that jumped up by 53% over the period, 9% annually and 6% from last year.
- Asians, making up close to 5% of the total student population, grew by 32% over the period, 6% annually, but dipped -1% from last year.
- Black students, with a large base (4,170 in Fall 2013), grew to be 5,475 in Fall 2018, realizing a 31% increase over the period, 6% annually and 5% from last year.
- American Indian grew by 17% over the period, 4% annually, but dipped by -3% from last year.
- International students (NR Alien) grew by 14% over the period, 3% annually, but dipped by -4% from last year.
- White students decreased by -7% over the period, by -2% annually and by -3% from last year.

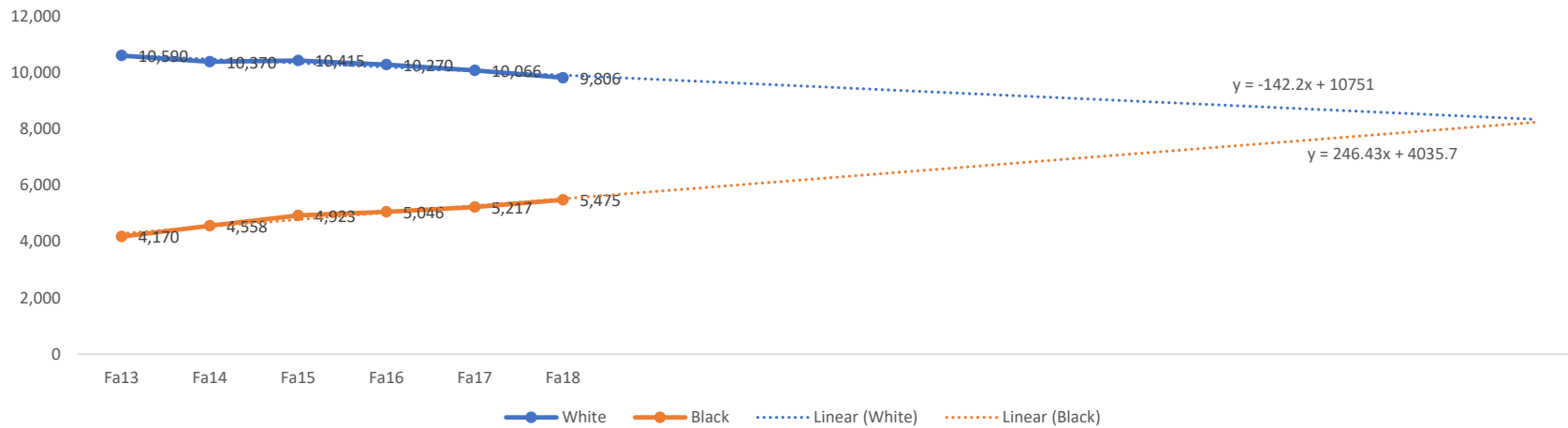
White and Non-White Enrollments, Past Actuals and Future Projections



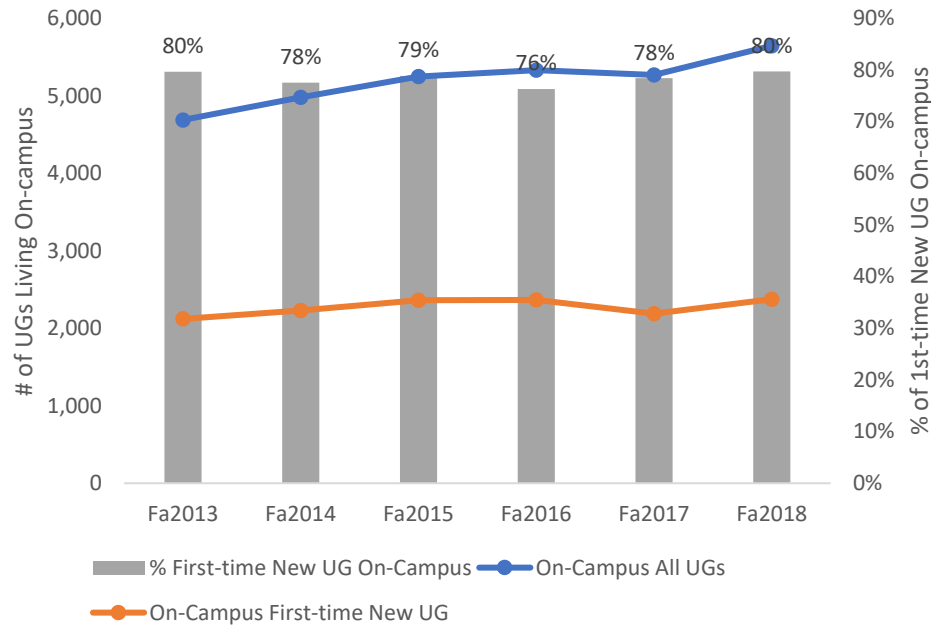
IR Observations:

- 1) The White student population at UNCG has been declining over the period from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018: by -7% over the period, by -2% annually during the period, by -3% from last year. Over the same period, the Non-White population increased: by 39% over the period, 7% annually during the period, and 5% from last year.
- 2) Fall 2018 is the first time at UNCG that the Non-White students exceed the White students in number: 9,939 compared with 9,806.
- 3) The Black student population at UNCG has been on the increase: by 31% over the period, by 6% annually during the period, and by 5% from last year.
- 4) If the current momentum holds, in Fall 2030, 12 years from now, there will be more Black students enrolled at UNCG than White students.
- 5) Are students services, academic or non-academic, geared up for the demographic changes of the student population?

IR Observations:

- 1) The proportion of undergraduates living on campus has grown by 20% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, 4% annually and 7% last year. With the incoming students becoming younger the trend of living on campus is likely to continue demanding more housing and services.
- 2) Eighty percent or four out of five first-time new undergraduates live on campus.

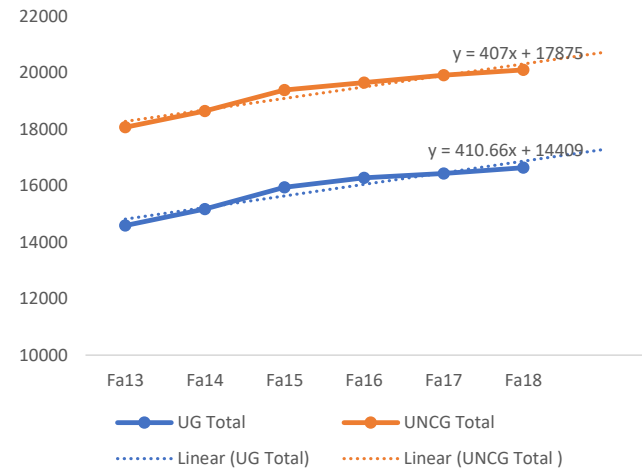

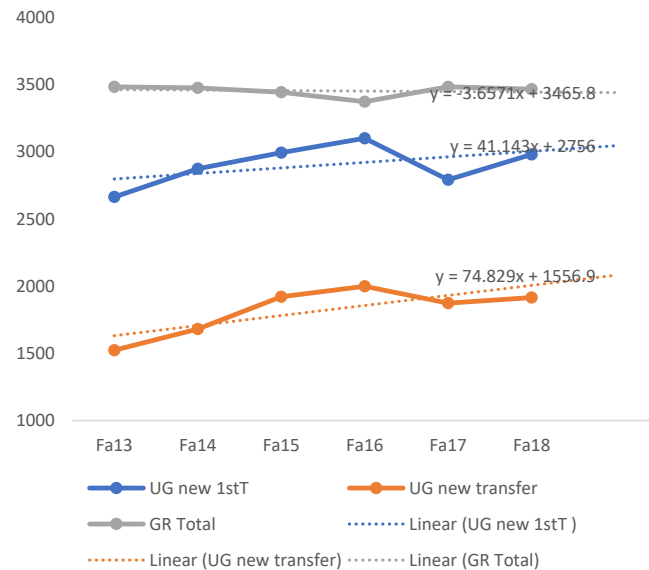
Institutional Research Observations:

- 1) The total enrollment at UNCG has been a modest increase: 1% up from Fall 2017 to Fall 2018, 2% up annually, and 11% up from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018.
- 2) Within the frame of the total modest increase, the number of first-time new students (freshmen) has increased at a faster rate: 7% from last year, 2% annually and 12% over the period.
- 3) The new transfer students grew even faster than the new first-time: 2% from last year, 5% annually and 26% over the period.
- 4) The fast growing entering undergraduate classes in the modest total growth unequivocally point out that the University may have lost enrollment to the retention of the students, evidenced by the not-so-fast growing continuing students and the deductions in other pockets of the student population, such as the graduate school.
- 5) The total enrollment is likely to be 20,513 in Fall 2019, a 2% increase from Fall 2018.
- 6) The total undergraduate enrollment is likely to be 17,052 in Fall 2019, 2.5% increase over Fall 2018.
- 7) The total graduate enrollment is going to be constant, about 3,460 in Fall 2019.

Enrollment of Undergraduate Total and University Grand Total



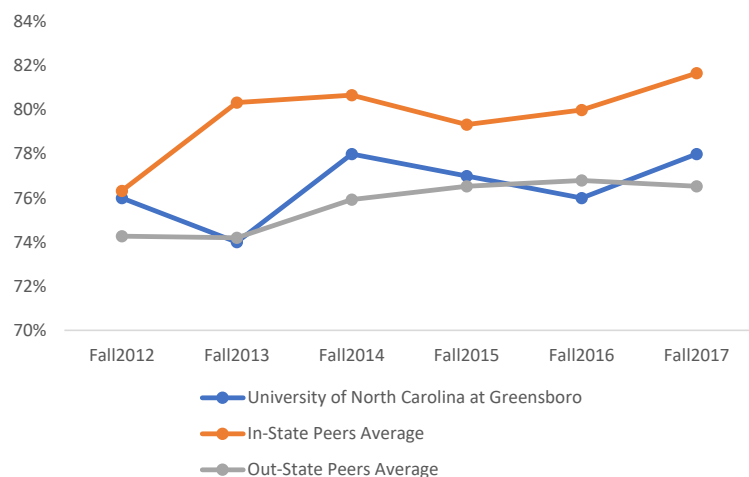
Enrollment of Undergraduate New 1stT, New Transfers, and Graduate Total

Highlights observed by Institutional Research:

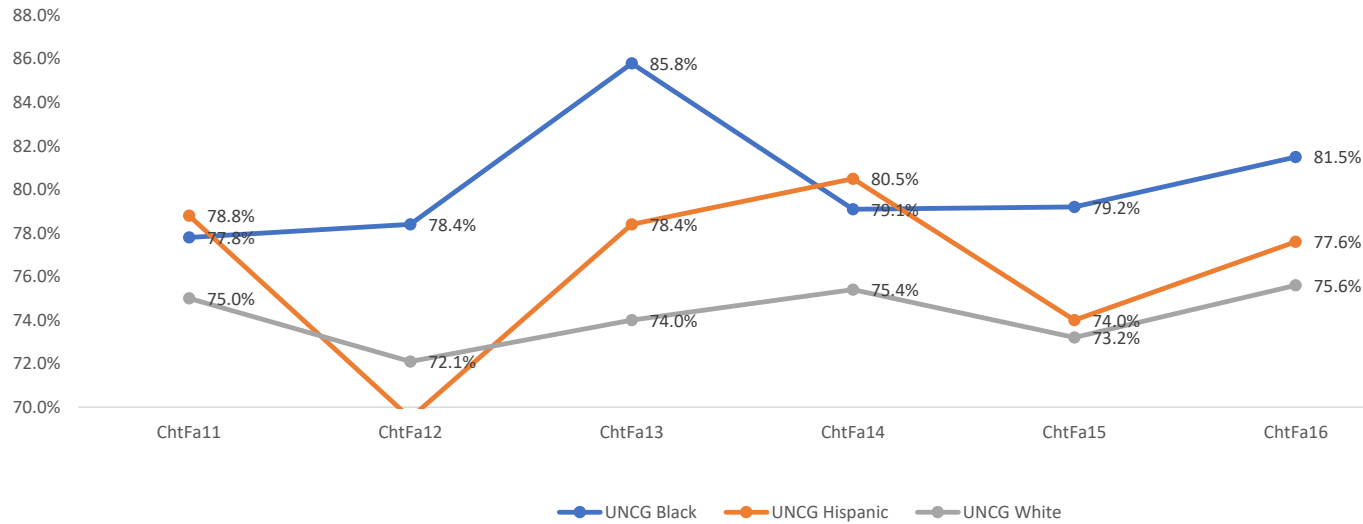
- 1) UNCG made sizable strides during the past six years in retaining its first-time full-time new undergraduate students, evidenced by the fact that in Fall 2013 UNCG was able to retain 74% of the Fall 2012's entering cohort while in Fall 2017 that percentage improved to 78%, the highest of the six years and an impressive margin over the beginning of the period.
- 2) Though improved, UNCG's 1-year retention lags behind that of its state peers, noticeably behind UNCC and ECU by 5% in Fall 2018, and behind NCAT by 1%. From Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, UNCG increased its retention by 2% compared to 5% of ECU, 6% of UNCC and 5% of NCAT.

1-Year Retention at UNCG

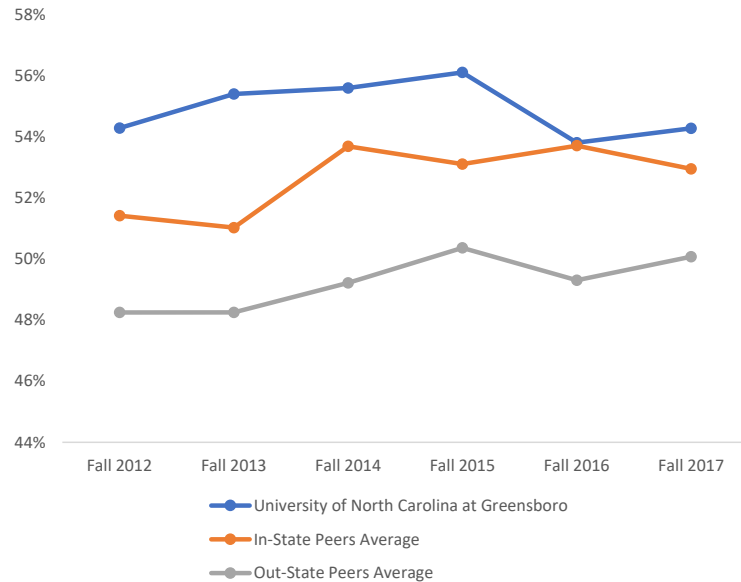

Highlights observed by Institutional Research:

- 1) UNCG's 6-year graduation rate has been higher than that of its state peers and national peers in most of the years, as clearly visualized by the chart to the left.
- 2) However, much of that advantage was lost in recent years when its 6-year graduation rate dropped to 54%, the same as UNCC, 8% behind ECU, and only better than NCAT.
- 3) Annually during the period, UNCG improved 0.0%, compared to 0.8% of ECU, 0.1% of UNCC, 0.3% of the state average, and 0.4% of the national average. From Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, UNCG did not achieve any improvement, compared to 2% of both the state peers' average and the national peers' average.

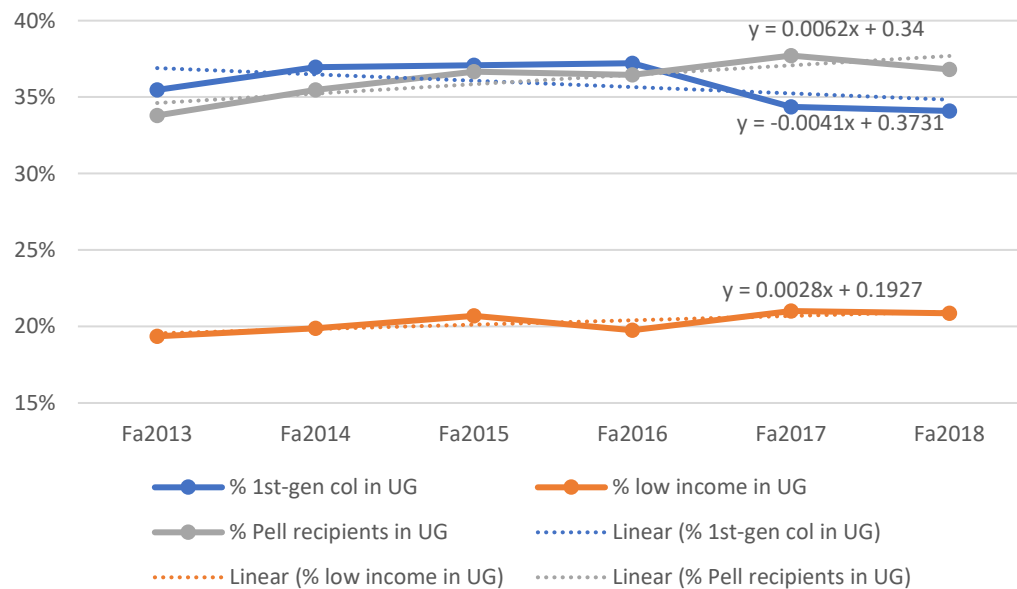

% of Undergraduates That Are 1st-generation College, From Low-Income Families, Received Pell Grants

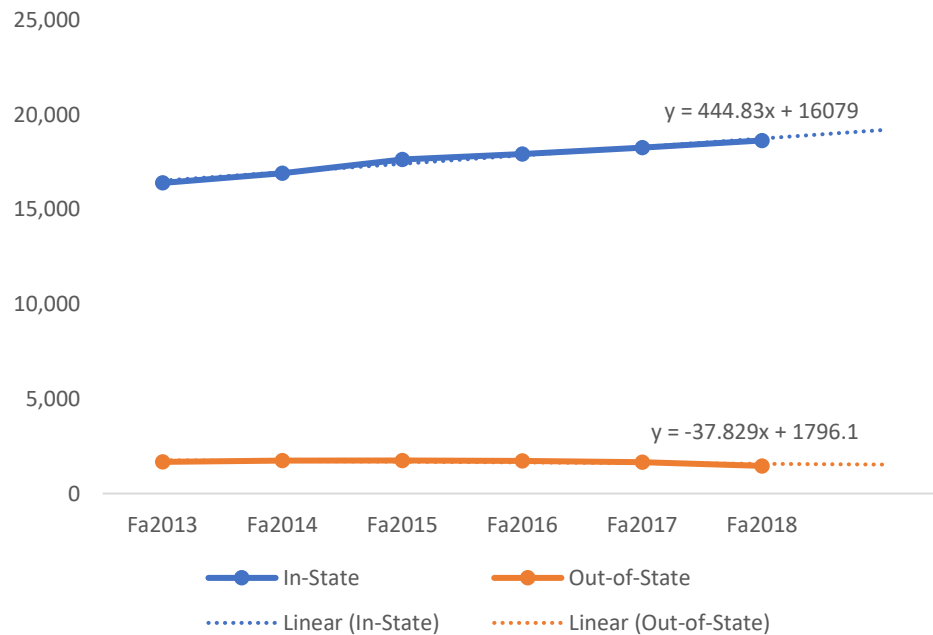

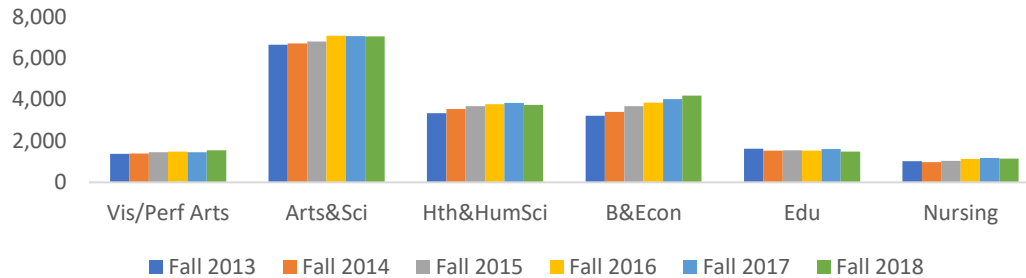

Institutional Research Observations

UNCG's enrollment is highly concentrated in the areas surrounding Greensboro. Guilford alone provides close to one third of the in-state enrollment. Guilford, Wake and Forsyth provide just about half of all the in-state population. Guilford, Wake, Forsyth, Mecklenburg and Alamance provide 58% or three out of five all in-state enrollment. Why did our market niche in Guilford dwindle in recent years?

Professional enrollment outgrew liberal arts enrollment over the past six years, as Business and Economics chalked off the largest increase: 5% annually, 30% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018 and 4% for last year. Nursing, Visual and Performing Arts, and Health and Human Services all had a 12% growth over the 6-year period. While School of Education had a -8% decrease over the same time period.

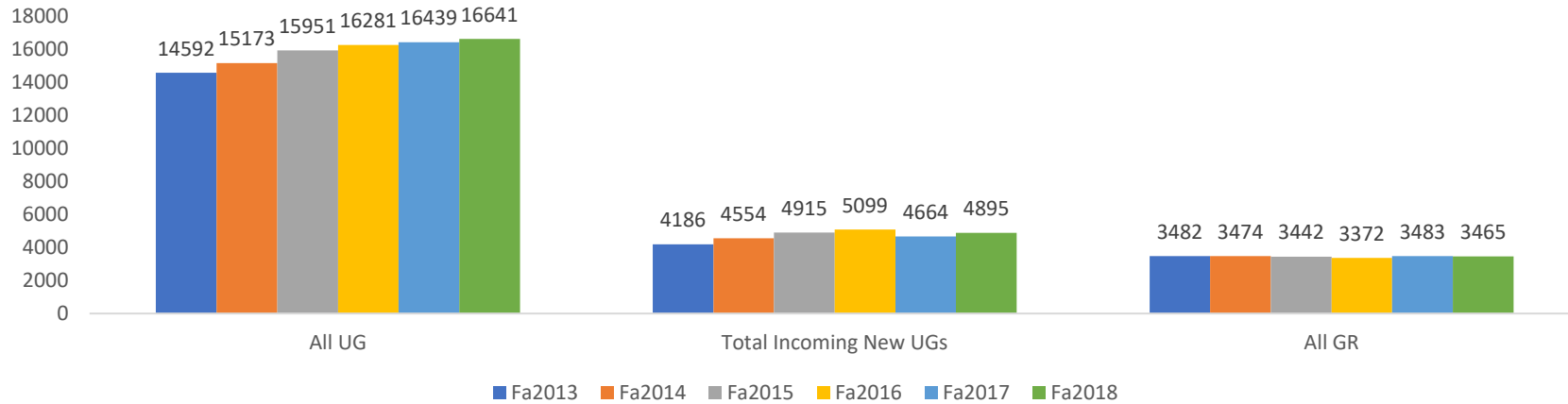
Enrollment by College

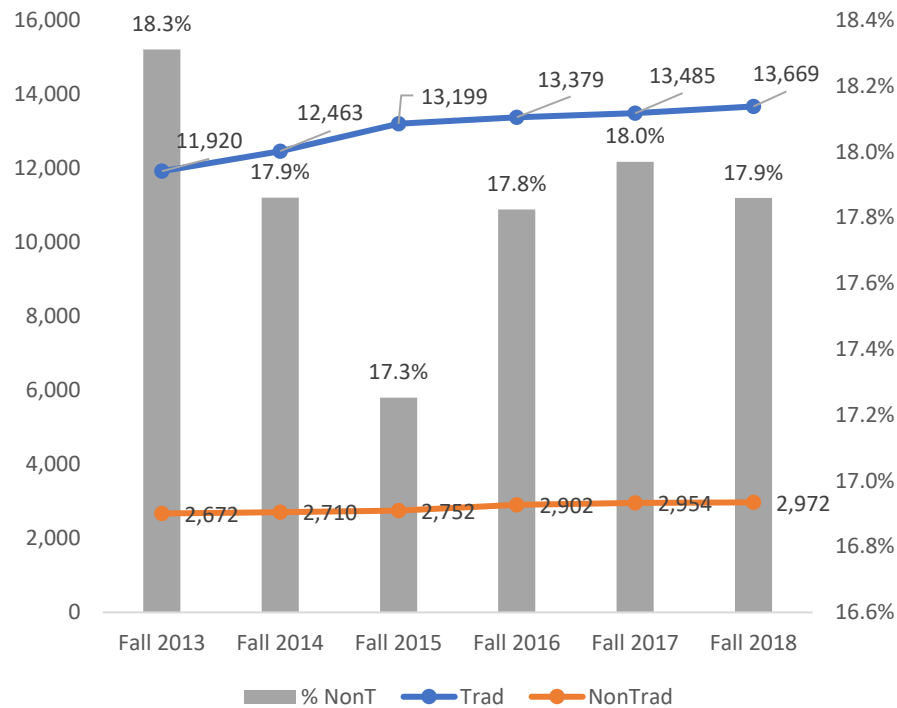
Headcount Enrollment by Class, Fall 2013 - Fall 2018

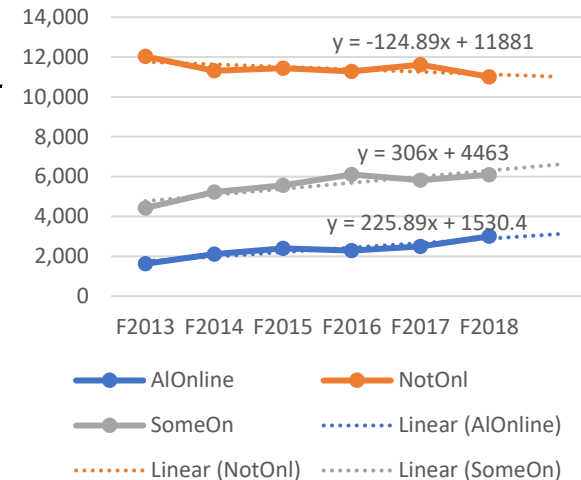
IR Observations of Online Enrollment Trends:

- The "All on line" students, those who took all their classes on line, achieved the the largest margin of increase: 85% from Fall 2013 to Fall 2018, 14% annually and 20% last year.
- The "Some on line", those who took some of their classes on line, also increased: 38% over the period, 7% annually and 5% from last year.
- The "Not on line", those who took no online classes, decreased by -8% during the period, -2% annually, and -5% from last year.
- The online credit hours, indicated by the table below, increased by 77% over the period, 12% annually and 13% from last year.
- The no hours online group, given the current momentum, will decrease at an annual rate of 125 students.
- The undergraduate online credit hours, given the current momentum, will increase at an annual rate of 3,262 credit hours.

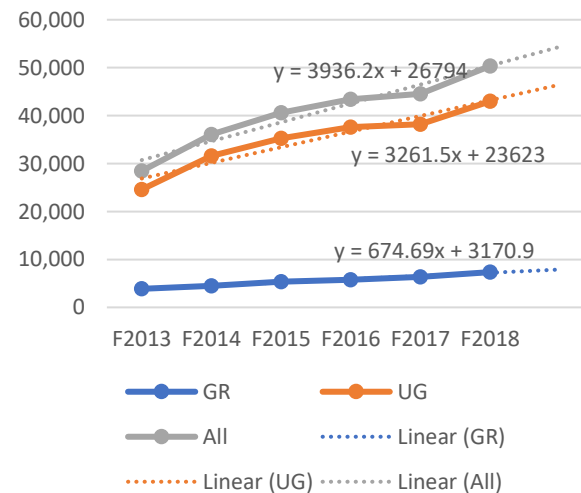

Headcount Enrollment of "All Hours Online", "Nothing On Line" and "Some Hours on Line"



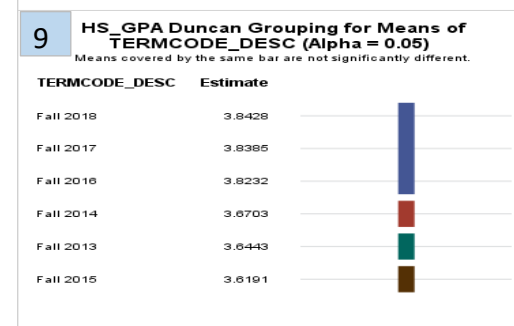
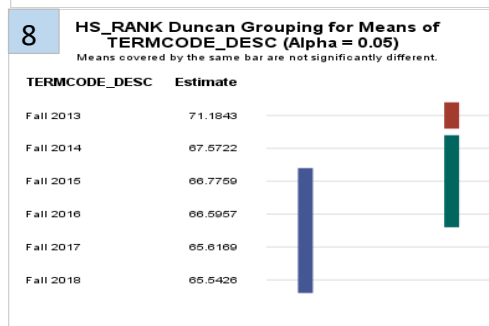
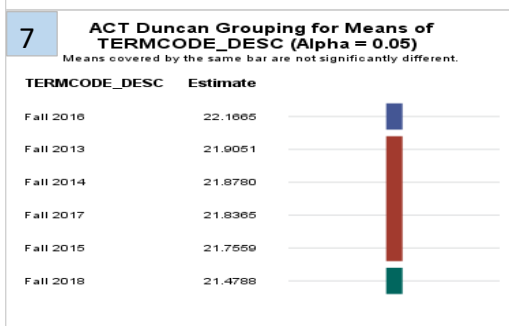
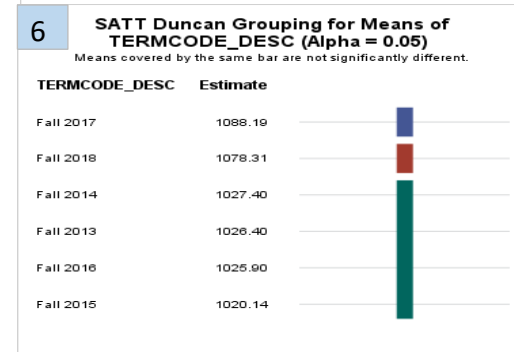
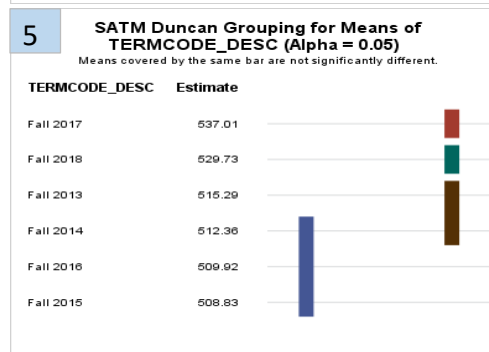
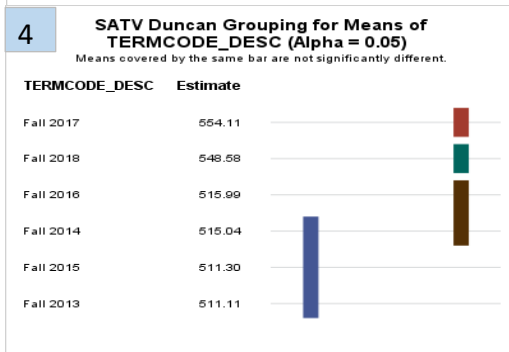
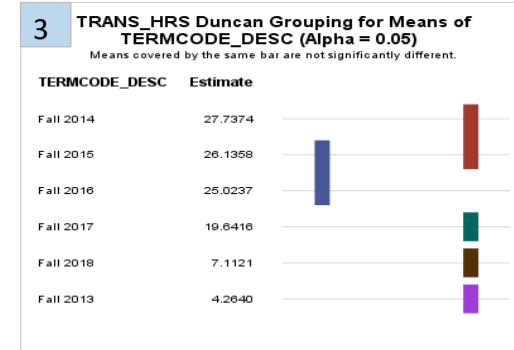
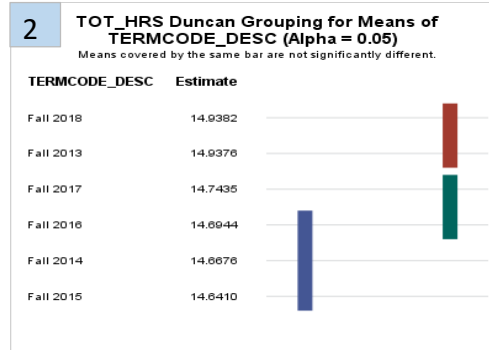
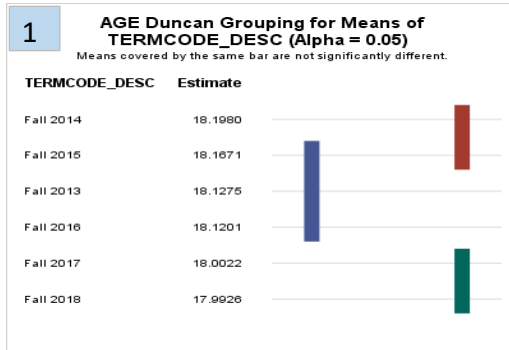
Number of Credit Hours On Line by Level

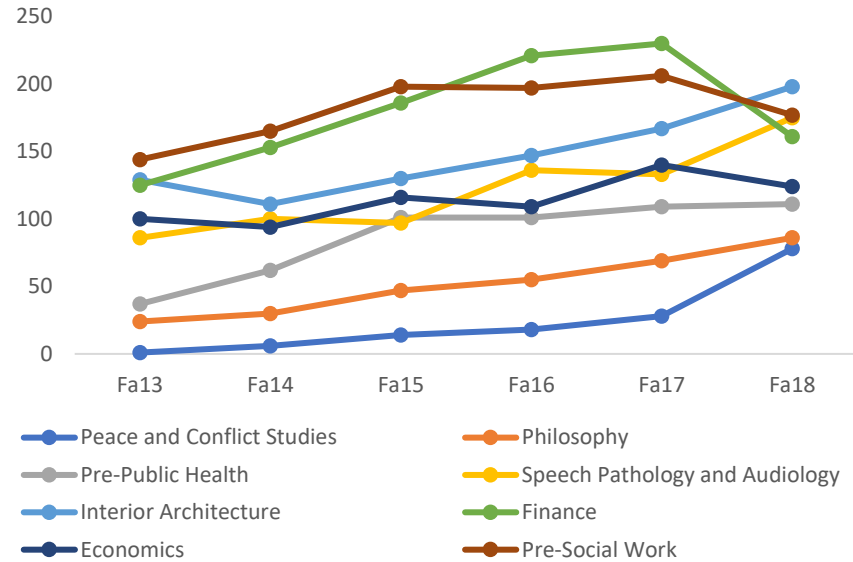
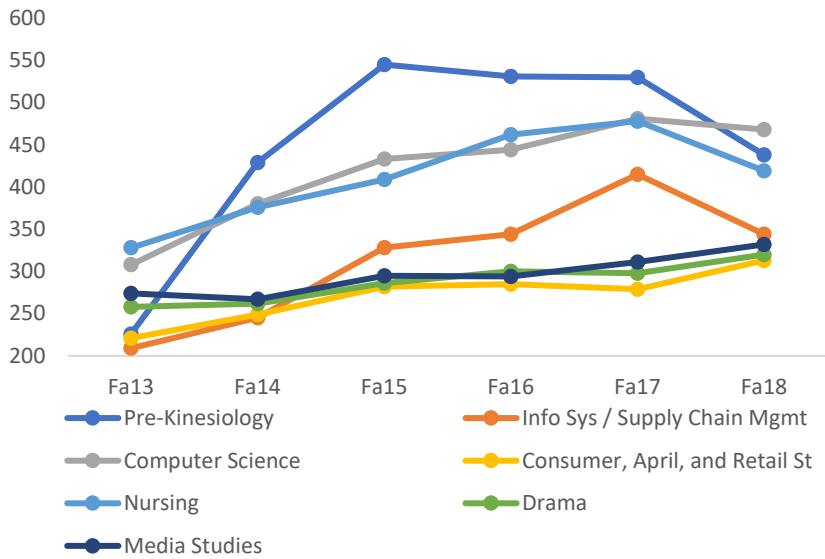


The Quality of the Incoming First-time Full-time Undergraduate Classes:

UGCG has matriculated better quality first-time full-time new students in recent years.

- SAT Verbal:** The SAT Verbal of the incoming class has been significantly higher in Fall 2017 and Fall 2018 (Chart 4).

- Total Hours:** The incoming class became more diligent as they took significantly more credit hours in Fall 2018, as indicated in Chart 2.
- Transfer Hours:** The transfer hours, AP or other, the incoming class brought in have been significantly lower in Fall 2018 (Chart 3).

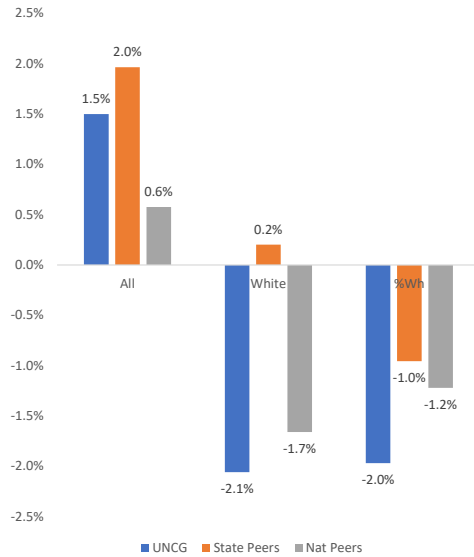

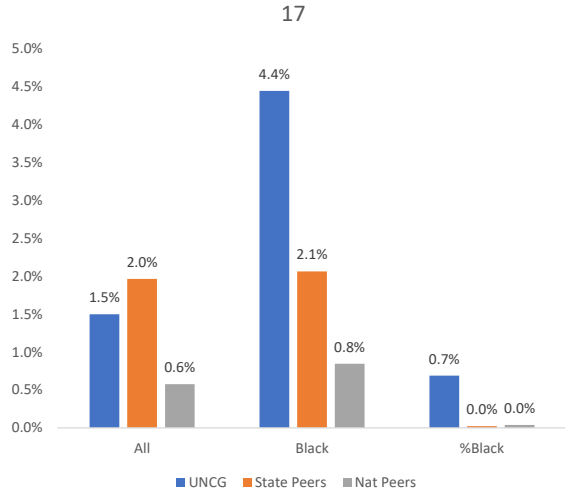
- 1) Over the six years, Fall 2012 - Fall 2017, the White student population at UNCG dipped faster than its state peers and national peers, evidenced by the fact that enrollment of White students at UNCG went down by -2.1% annually, while the state peers' average was up by 0.2% and the national average was down by -1.7% annually.
- 2) The share of White students in the total student population shrank by -2 percentage points annually over the period from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017. This is a quicker shrinking rate than the state peers' average (-1 percentage point) and the national peers' average (-1.2 percentage points).

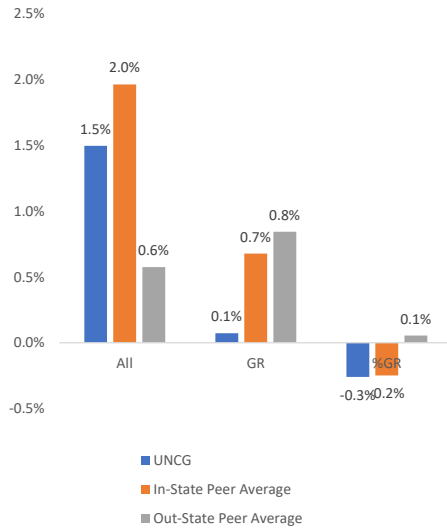
- Over the six years, Fall 2012 - Fall 2017, enrollment of Black students at UNCG went up by 4.4% annually. Such a growth rate was much quicker than that of the state peers (2.1%) and that of the national peers (0.8%).
- The share of Black students in the total student population grew by 0.7 percentage points annually over the period from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017. This is a quicker growth than the state peers' average and the national peers' average.

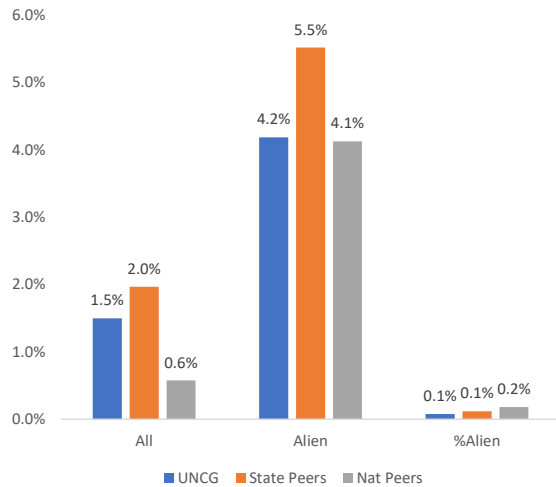
- Over the six years, Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, the total students enrolled at UNCG grew by 1.5% annually. Such a growth rate was faster than its national peers' average (0.6%), but slower than its state peers (2.0%).
- The graduate population at UNCG increased only by 0.1% annually over the Fall 2012 - 17 period, compared to 0.7% annually for the in-state peers and 0.8% annually for the national peers. Apparently UNCG is falling behind state and national peers in its graduate enrollment growth.
- In Fall 2012 close to one out of five students (18.8%) at UNCG was in its graduate school, compared to 19.5% of its state peers and 20.7% of its national peers. In Fall 2017, 17.5% of all UNCG students were in its graduate school, compared to 18.2% of its state peers and 21.0% of its national peers. During this period, the graduate school share of the UNCG total shrank by -0.3% annually, compared to -0.2% of its state peers and 0.1% growth of its national peers. Apparently UNCG's graduate school, as of the total enrollment, became smaller, compared with its state and national peers.

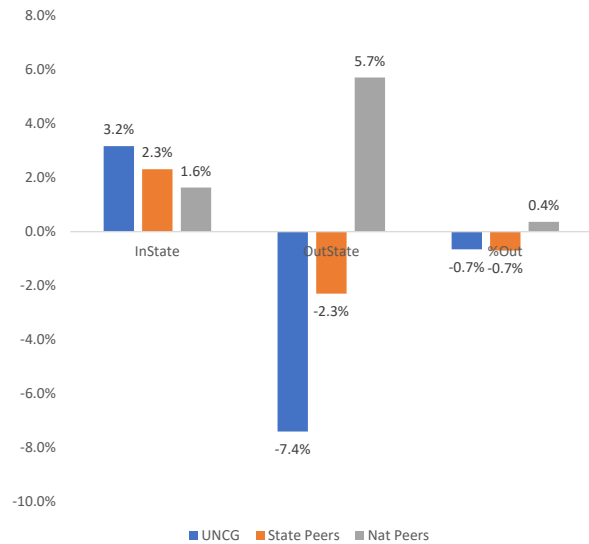

Highlights Observed by Institutional Research:

UNCG is becoming more in-state than out-state in the last six years from Fall 2012 to Fall 2017, evidenced by the fact that its in-state first-time new undergraduate enrollment increased by 3.2% while the out-state enrollment decreased by -7.4%. Such a trend was accented by a comparison with its state peers' average increase of 2.3% and out-state decrease of -2.3%. The national peers' average compares UNCG drastically that while their in-state enrollment increased by 1.6%, the out-state enrollment increased by 5.7%.
